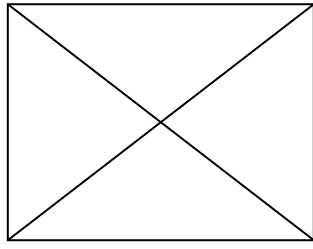

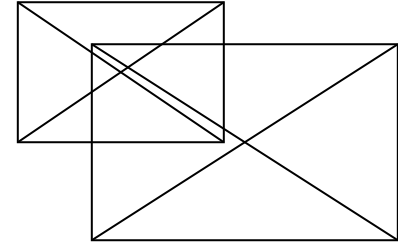
Scenario 5: Get a WE ID Badge
